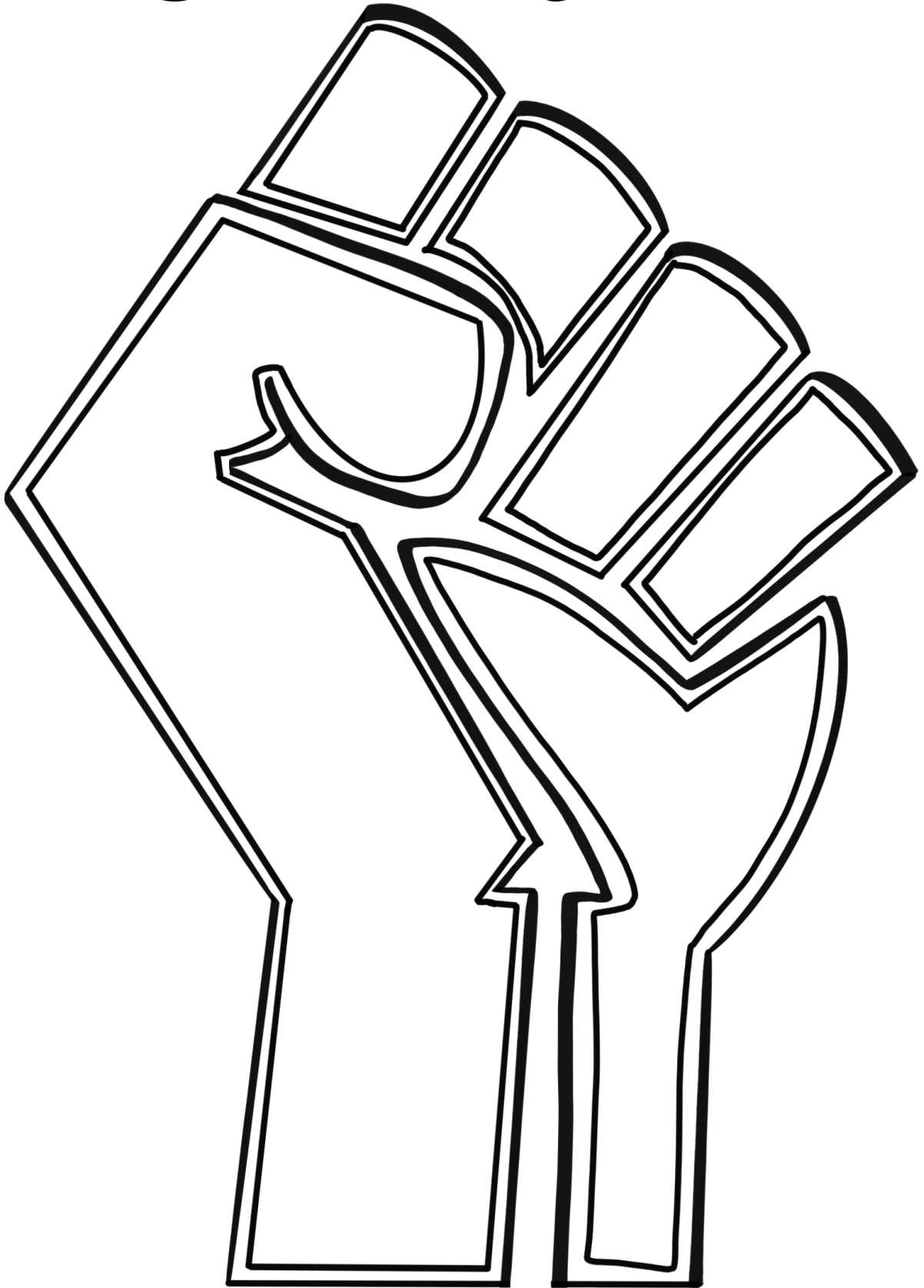
Concrete poetry is poetry that uses visuals to match the meaning or topic of the poem. This type of poetry is also known as 'shape poetry.'

- Don't be afraid to use color.


