Your assignment is to create a miniature heritage fair display on the tri-fold paper provided. Your topic is the three First Nation clans which we have discussed in this chapter, the Mi'kmaq, Haudenosaunee, and the Anishinabe.

On your tri-fold dedicate **ONE** panel for each of the three clans

Use the information from your notebook as the basis of your information. Make sure that you include the following key points:

1. Where did each group live?
2. How did they get their food and what kinds of foods did they eat?
3. What kinds of government structures did they have, who was in charge?
4. How did they make decisions?
5. How important was nature?
6. What was the role of women?

Also make sure to include the following:

- A title for your presentation
- One mini map – indicating the territory of each of the 3 tribes (use the one provided in class.)
- Pictures, drawings and illustrations
- Artifacts – these can be replicas made out of modelling clay or other materials. They should be a three dimensional representation of something that was important to that particular tribe.



Use your best presentation skills.

- Colour
- Proper use of fonts or neat printing
- Good design practices, evenly laid out and straight
- Remember a picture is worth a thousand words so there should be several pictures included in your presentation
- Include your name and class pattern somewhere on your tri-fold
